Gospel Reflection

Pentecost is a time when we remember how the Holy Spirit came to the disciples. This event transformed them and gave them the power to spread God's word. It reminds us that the same Spirit is present in our lives today. The Holy Spirit gives us courage, helps us remember God's presence, and calls us to live as witnesses of God's love.

Through the Spirit, God gives us the courage to speak His message to the world. He gives us strength to be prophets. He inspires us to comfort those in need of care. This transformation is especially clear on Pentecost.

When the Holy Spirit came upon the scared and hidden disciples, they were changed. They spoke boldly about Jesus, even in the face of danger. This courage comes from knowing that God's Spirit lives within us. We share in the relationship between the Father and the Son which gives us the strength to carry out our mission.


The Holy Spirit calls us to be active witnesses in the world. This means living out the love and truth of the Gospel every day. We show God's love through our actions and how we treat others. Each act of kindness or moment of truth-telling is a reflection of God's love. We are not just telling others about Jesus; we are showing them His love in action.

On Pentecost, we celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit. We remember the courage He gives us to speak God's word and live out His love. We remind ourselves to seek His presence in our lives, especially when we feel alone or afraid. And we commit to being His witnesses in the world, living out the Gospel in our actions and relationships. Let us embrace the Spirit's power within us, and let us share His love with everyone we meet.

Reflection Questions

- When have you felt the Holy Spirit giving you the courage to speak about your faith? How did you respond?
- Can you recall a moment when you strongly felt God's presence through the Holy Spirit? How did that experience change your outlook or actions?
- How often do you pray for the Holy Spirit to stir within you? What specific gifts of the Spirit do you seek most in your life right now?

2nd Annual Parish Garage Sale! Friday & Saturday May 24th - 25th 8 am - 3 pm



FAMILY CONNECTION

Pentecost is sometimes called the birthday of the Church. The Gospel for Pentecost reminds us that the Church begins with the command to forgive. Within the family, the domestic church, we learn how to forgive and how to accept forgiveness. The gift of the Holy Spirit enables us to do both. Today is a fitting time to share a family celebration of reconciliation.As you gather together as a family, sit quietly for a few minutes, inviting everyone to reflect upon their need to forgive and to receive forgiveness. If there is a situation or issue within the family that needs attention, spend some time reflecting on how your family might address it. Read together today's Gospel, John 20:19-23. Talk together about how Jesus gave us the gift of the Holy Spirit to help us in the work of forgiveness and to bring us peace. Pray together today's psalm or the Prayer to the Holy Spirit, asking that the Holy Spirit help your family. Share with one another the Sign of Peace.


