Dear Parish Family,

I want to thank you for the many generous gifts of *time*, *talent* and *treasure* that you share with Our Lady of Fatima Parish throughout the year. We are very

blessed that so many parishioners respond to the needs our faith community, not only in our parish, but as well as at the Diocesan level and in the outreach we do to so many charitable organizations we help throughout the year through our 10% tithing.

Since few of us Catholics have ever challenged ourselves with this kind of giving, we may ask ourselves, how do I handle so many asks? One of the ideas was to invite everyone to consider the 5% to parish, 4% to the charities of your choice, and the other 1% to the Diocese through the ACA. It just seemed that this type of plan would help to relieve all the guilt that we experience from having to be confronted with so many "asks".

With that as a context it is that time of the year where Mother Church invites to *Plan our giving' for* the next year and in a very particular way this weekend to the different ministries funded by the Diocesan Offices through the Annual Catholic Appeal. This appeal is the *once a year* opportunity we have to support the Ministry of Our Bishop in Central Washington.

There are few who take up this opportunity to trust God with their lives and their livelihood to this extent of tithing. Probably you may say, is Father asking for money again? Actually no, we already donate to our Diocese. This is just a tool and reminder that we are at that time of the year and Mother Church encourages us to renew our annual commitment for those who already participate in previous years. And for those who have not, I would really encourage you be part of this effort.

You might have received already in the mail the envelope from Bishop regarding the Annual Catholic Appeal, and perhaps responded to it already. I thank you for your continual support. If you have not received it, or are doing it for the first time, you will find envelopes in the pews. Please prayerfully consider tithing the 1% for Our Diocese.

Remember that God asks different people to share in different ways, and it is up to us to respond as He asks us individually.

Gospel Reflection

In the Baptism of the Lord, we reflect on the special event of Jesus' baptism. Jesus, though sinless, chose to be baptized by John the Baptist, who called people to repent. On the Baptism of the Lord Year C, we reflect on the baptism of Jesus. This event reveals Jesus' humility, marks the start of his mission, and shows the Trinity. By looking at Jesus' baptism, we can understand more about our own baptism and the call to serve and love others.

A Sign of Love and Humility

Why did Jesus, who had no need to repent, decide to be baptized? One reason is that Jesus wanted to show his support and understanding for us. He wanted to share in our humanity and weaknesses. By being baptized, Jesus stood with those who were seeking forgiveness and a new start. He showed that he was not distant from us but very close, sharing in our struggles. Another reason is that Jesus' baptism was a way to begin his mission. It was a public sign that he was ready to do God's work. The heavens opened, and the Holy Spirit came down like a dove. A voice from heaven said, "You are my beloved Son; with you, I am well pleased." This showed that Jesus was chosen by God for a special purpose.

Through Jesus' baptism, we see how much God loves us. Jesus showed that he is with us in our joys and our difficulties. He came to save us and to show us the way to God. By being baptized, Jesus showed that he was one of us, sharing in everything we go through.

A Call to Serve and Love

This weekend, we remember the day Jesus was baptized. This event marked the beginning of his important work. When Jesus came out of the water, he prayed, making it clear that this was a special moment in his life. The Holy Spirit came down on him like a dove. This is similar to how the Spirit empowered the disciples at Pentecost for their mission. Jesus' baptism prepared him to spread the good news, heal broken hearts, and set people free. He was ready to do God's work and to show God's love to everyone. Jesus cared for people like a shepherd cares for sheep. He was gentle, kind, and always ready to help those in need.

When we think about Jesus' baptism, we should also think about our own baptism. Our baptism prepares us to share in the work of Jesus. We are called to care for one another, to help those in need, to show mercy and love, and to guide others toward God's goodness. Baptism makes us part of God's family and gives us a mission to share God's love with others. Just as Jesus was empowered by the Holy Spirit, we are also given the strength to do good in our lives. We can bring hope to those who are sad, help those who are struggling, and show kindness to everyone we meet. Through our actions, we can show the love of God in the world.

A Glimpse of the Trinity

In the Baptism of the Lord we see a special moment where the Trinity is revealed. The baptism of Jesus shows us the presence of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. This gives us a glimpse into the Trinitarian nature of God. As Jesus is baptized, the heavens open, and the Holy Spirit comes down like a dove. At the same time, a voice from heaven speaks, saying, "You are my beloved Son; with you, I am well pleased." Here, we see the Father speaking from heaven, the Son being baptized, and the Holy Spirit descending. This moment shows us how the three Persons of the Trinity are present and working together.

This scene helps us understand that God is a community of love. The Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit are united and share in the work of salvation. Jesus' baptism marks the beginning of his mission to bring God's love to the world. The Holy Spirit empowers him, and the Father's voice affirms him. When we think about the Trinity revealed at Jesus' baptism, we are reminded that our own baptism also connects us to this loving relationship. We are invited to share in the life of the Trinity and to spread God's love to others. Just as the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are united in love and mission, we are called to live in love and to serve others in our daily lives.

Reflecting on the Baptism of the Lord Year C helps us see Jesus' love, the beginning of his mission, and the unity of the Trinity. It reminds us of our own baptism and our call to live in love and service. We are invited to join in Jesus' mission and share God's love with everyone.

Prayer

Lord, thank you for the gift of baptism. Help us to follow Jesus' example of love and service. Fill us with your Holy Spirit so we can bring hope and kindness to others. Amen.

Reflection Questions

- What does it mean for us that Jesus was baptized and empowered by the Holy Spirit?
 - How can we see our own baptism as a call to mission?
 - In what ways can we show love and service to others as Jesus did?

FAMILY CONNECTION

Every family has a unique identity that is defined by the behaviors, attitudes, and expectations that govern a family's daily life. This identity is influenced by the family history of the parents, but each family's expression of this history is unique. In today's Gospel, we learn that Jesus' behavior, attitudes, and expectations were governed by his identity as God's beloved Son. In our Baptism, we were made children of this same heavenly Father. This identity as members of the family of God, and as brothers and sisters of Jesus, also shapes our family's daily life.

As you gather as a family, identify some of the expectations and behaviors that govern your family life by answering the question, "What are some of the things that make our family life unique?" Celebrate these things about your family life. Read today's Gospel, Luke 3:15-16,21-22. Observe that Jesus' identity as the Beloved Son of the Father governed his behaviors, attitudes, and expectations. Recall that at our Baptism we were made children of this same heavenly Father. How does this identity as a member of the family of God govern and shape our family life? Conclude in prayer together that we will remain faithful to our baptismal identity as children of God and as brothers or sisters of Jesus. Conclude by praying together the Lord's Prayer.






